Editorial Graphics and Publishing Services How to Use a Comma With Abbreviations Following a Person's Name

- DO use a comma to set off Esq. and other abbreviations that represent degrees or religious orders. For example: Roscoe Parker, Esq., is our representative in Washington, D.C.
 Rev. James Tooley, S.J., will lead the group in prayer before the meeting.
 Molly Grainger, M.D., is leaving to join Doctors without Borders this year.
 Cheryl Kingsley, Ed. D., wrote a book on special education, which was published last year.
 DO NOT use a comma to set off Jr., Sr., or roman or arabic numerals. For example: Lieutenant Peter Holly Jr.
 - Adrian Bond Sr.
 - Robert Beard 2nd
 - Ellen Smith III

Exception: If you know that the person prefers to use commas in his or her name.
