

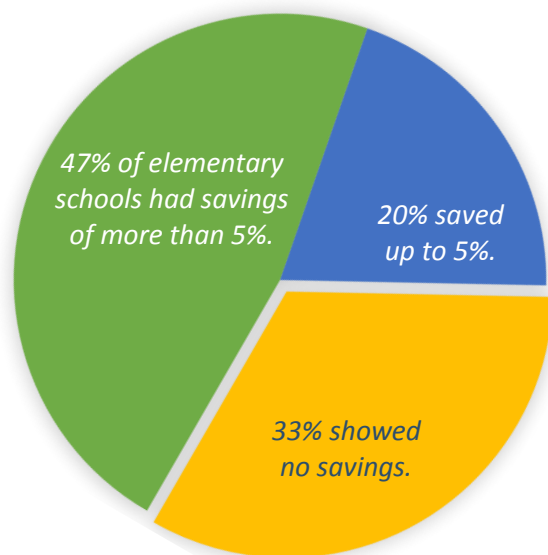


2016–2017 Second Quarter ENERGY AWARD

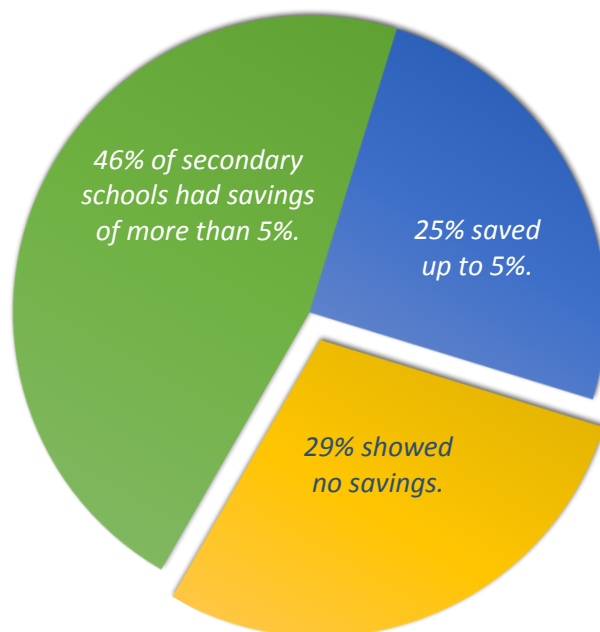
