PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

We have had a busy, informative, and fun year at our luncheons and on our many trips. This year we also welcomed two new members to our Board of

Directors: Dr. Debra Munk, Consumer Education Chair and Judy Reiff, Trips Chair.

Changes in chairpersons include: Juliette Trevino, Archives Committee; Harvey Strine, Auditing Committee; Dr. Kenneth Muir, Budget Committee; Frieda Price, Community Service; and Dr. Stephen Raucher, Nominating Committee. We have had a successful year supporting our special projects: Toolkits and The Josiah Henson Park. We appreciate your donations sustaining support for these projects. (See pages 3 and 13)

Every two years, the Montgomery County Public Schools Retirees Association (MCPSRA) Political Action Committee (PAC) invites candidates who are running for office to complete a questionnaire and to interview with the committee. We do this as a service to our members because many of these candidates and their positions are not well known and, for many of us, it's difficult to get relevant information about the candidates.

This year, 172 people filed for County Executive, and positions on the County Council, the Board of Education, and the Maryland General Assembly. Political Action Committee Chair LeeAnn Kaye lead a six-member team that interviewed a total of 120 candidates over sixteen days. Questions focused on pensions, budgets, health care, public funds for private schools, taxes and knowledge of issues.

Based on the candidates' questionnaire responses and interviews, the PAC made the recommendations that are printed on page 12 of this newsletter. We considered only those candidates who returned their questionnaires and were interviewed. Decisions were based on many factors, including: written and oral responses, effectiveness as an elected official or community volunteer, campaign viability, as well as reflecting the diversity of the county.

At the Maryland Retired School Personnel Association (MRSPA) Annual Business Meeting on May 8, MCPSRA received the 2017-18 Membership Award for locals with over 900 members. This recognition was for the Largest Percentage Increase and the Largest Numerical Increase for New Members. Kudos to our Membership Chair Juliette Trevino.

In May, the members of the MCPSRA Scholarship Committee reviewed applications from MCPS staff. Our scholarships are meant to help with tuition for studies pursued during the summer or fall semesters of 2018. Scholarship awardees will be introduced at our June 14 luncheon. We hope you can join us to honor them.

There will be a vacancy for the chair of the Political Action Committee. If you are interested, please contact me at john.dahlberg234@gmail.com.

For the past fourteen years, our association has been committed to providing toolkits of school supplies for needy incoming kindergartners who attend a special Title I Extended Learning Opportunities Summer Adventures In Learning (ELO SAIL) program each summer. We were hopeful that we could continue to do so again not only this summer but for many years to come. In the April newsletter we issued a **HELP NEEDED! URGENT!** appeal for contributions. MCPSRA Consumer Education Update

Excerpted from MRSA "Consumer Connection" March-April 2018

Fire Extinguishers

To make sure your fire extinguisher is safe and operates properly:

- Check whether you own a re-called model at Kidde.com and find out how to get a free replacement.
- Make sure you have the right size and type of fire extinguisher for areas of your home such as your kitchen and garage.
- Replace your extinguisher unless it has a metal operating lever and is rated "ABC" which means that it uses the dry chemical, monoammonium phosphate to put out fires from three common household sources: paper/wood/plastics and flammable liquids such as grease and gasoline, and electrical equipment.
- If you have a kitchen smaller than 70 square feet or a one-car garage, buy an all-purpose extinguisher with the rating on the label of 1A-

10B-C. Larger areas require a rating of at least 3A-40B-C.

 To use your extinguisher properly, pull out the safety pin before you squeeze the operating lever. If you panic and try to squeeze the lever while simultaneously pulling out the pin, the extinguisher will not work. Aim the extinguisher nozzle at the base of the fire-this allows the dry chemical to smother it. Use a sweeping motion until the fire is fully out.

THIS IS CLEVER!

Can you name one word in English language that can be a noun, verb, adj, adv, or prep? The word <u>UP</u> may be the only one.

Read the following passage until the end... I'm sure you'll laugh.
