CELEBRATING FIFTEEN YEARS OF SUCCESS

The MCPSRA **Toolkits**, **Books**, **and Backpacks Project** has just completed its fifteenth year. During that time, we provided nearly 20,000 kits and 225 backpacks of school supplies, and 8,900 new books to economically challenged Title I ELO SAIL elementary summer school children.

The success of our project over the years has been due to all the individuals, organizations, and corporate sponsors that contributed in so many ways and especially to this summer's kits. First, we wish to express our gratitude to the 305 individual donors who responded to our urgent plea for monetary contributions that amounted to \$27,721.50. This covered the entire expenses for the kits assembled for this year. This hasn't always happened in years past. A very special thanks to the Educational Systems Federal Credit Union for not only providing 4,000 pencils and 2,000 rulers for inclusion in the kits but also for donating \$1,000, which they have done each year for over 12 years. The Germantown Target Store again this summer acquired the 2,000 shoe boxes at cost for us. Thanks to the hundreds of people who collected the more than 110,000 plastic bottle caps needed for the math activities included in the kits, especially Ramarion King and the residents of Asbury Methodist Village in Gaithersburg, students at Seneca Valley HS, church groups, and even athletes at a soccer complex in Philadelphia who heard about our collection and delivered them here to us. A very special thank you goes to a special group of Wootton HS students who spent months counting out and bagging some of the caps for us. Enormous thanks go to Diane Wells and Pam Grant who spent hundreds of hours on this summer's project from its onset to its completion. Most importantly, our project would not be possible without

Lanny Taylor, along with his crew, at the MCPS Department Materials Management warehouse who provides space to assemble the kits, orders items for in the kits, and distributes them to the schools. Finally, thanks to all the Title I specialists and Camiele Jones-Akinkuowo who coordinated this summer's project at the 22 school sites and conducted parent seminars on how to use the items and lessons plans in the kits with their children at home.

Vote YES on Question 1

When Marylanders approved casino gaming, we thought the new revenue would increase education funding. While almost \$2 billion in casino revenue went into the Education Trust Fund — which can only be used for funding public education — nearly the same amount of existing funding was *shifted* from education to other parts of the state budget. The result? The new revenue from casinos *didn't add* to existing funding; it supplanted or simply maintained existing, minimum levels.

Passing (Constitutional Amendment) Question 1, which will be on the General Election ballot on November 6, will Fix the Fund, stop this budget gimmick, and ensure that casino revenues go to *increasing* or supplementing school funding over current levels. This could be an influx of \$500 million dollars within 4 years to education funding.

Because local school systems would benefit from this additional revenue, it could mean better protection for the health benefits you enjoy as a retired educator.

votes. One House of Delegates race was decided by 12

"There is no second place in politics. You lose the
championship game, you're runner-up. You come in
second at the Olympics, you get a silver medal. You
lose the election, you just lose. There is no second
place." (Tony Fazio)

JOSIAH The Story That Sparked the American Civil War

Narrated by Danny Glover

On August 10, 2018 The Montgomery Parks Foundation hosted the local premiere of *Josiah*, a documentary film, at the American Film Institute Silver Theater in Downtown Silver Spring, which traces Josiah Henson's harrowing journey from slavery in Montgomery County and Kentucky to freedom in Canada.



Many members of MCPSRA are already aware of his story from presentations at our quarterly luncheons and the contributions to the Foundation to support the development of the Josiah Henson Park Museum and Education Center.

A large group of Henson descendants attended the screening. They were here for an annual family reunion. The August 10th screening was sold out and an additional showing was scheduled for the next day to accommodate the community interest.

The screening was followed by a Q and A with the filmmaker Jared Block, Catherine Leggett, Montgomery County First Lady, Montgomery Parks Historian Jamie Kuhns and Josiah Henson descendant Dennis Green, moderated by historian Anthony Cohen of the Menare Foundation.

Josiah Henson (1789-1883) spent 41 years enslaved. He was a principled man who overcame incredible odds to escape his enslavers and improve the lives of hundreds of freed people. His real story has until now been largely lost to history even though he was immortalized by Harriet Beecher Stowe in "Uncle Tom's Cabin" ir
