

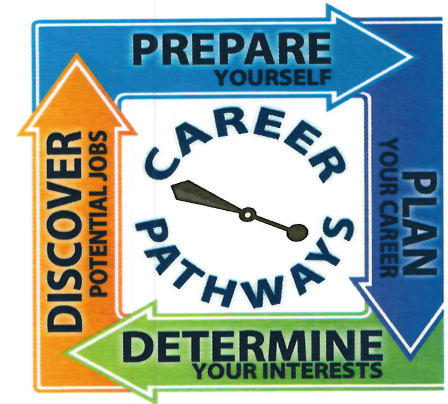

April 5, 12, 19, & 26, 4:30 to 6:30 p.m. 45 W. Gude Dr., Maple Room

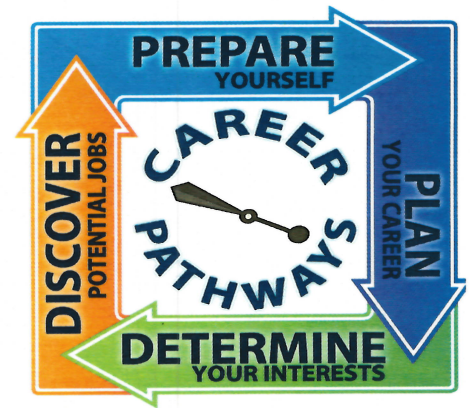
