PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE Dr. Stephen M. Raucher

President - MCPSRA

We just came through a particularly turbulent election cycle, where

numbers of popular votes, electoral votes, and delegates were all over the news. Then, I was listening to an advertisement (for a car, I think) which had a catchy jingle about the number zero. It said something like: "My hero zero, before you we could only count on fingers and toes" etc. As a former high school math teacher, all of this emphasis on numbers made me recall the old adage that "numbers matter". Whether it is the number of votes received by a candidate; the size of your pension check; the performance of the stock market; your cholesterol or credit score; or the weight shown on your bathroom scale – numbers mean a lot to each of us every day!

This is particularly true in advocacy groups; size matters a lot. The larger the group, the more attention its legislative platform receives by elected bodies. Just look at the literature that fills our mailboxes daily. It seems that each group that wants my support is telling me how many others are already enrolled and how I can help to make a difference by adding myself to their roles. My friends, MCPSRA is no different. One of, if not the first questions I get when advocating for things like maintaining or improving our health benefits is "How many members do you represent?"

Some of the most important aspects of our lives are "controlled" by legislative bodies. At the federal level, it is Congress that sets our Medicare and Social Security policy. Our pension benefits are primarily governed by the Legislature and Governor of the State of Maryland. The Local Pension System (AETNA), which mirrors the state system, is controlled by the BOE. Our MCPS Health Insurance, Prescription Drug Insurance, Dental Insurance and Vision coverage are totally and unilaterally governed by the Montgomery County Board of Education (BOE).

It is our association that tracks potential changes and advocates for the maintenance and improvement of these vital aspects of our lives. Our state association, MRSPA, is affiliated with AARP through which it lobbies on our behalf at the federal level. MRSPA also maintains a legislative presence in Annapolis and works with other associations, such as the United Seniors of Maryland, to advocate at the state level. Our association, MCPSRA, is the recognized advocacy group that works with the MCPS BOE.

Your annual dues, currently \$45, buys you all of the above listed advocates at the Federal, State and Local level – a very modest investment to advance and protect our future. SO... why aren't we a larger number than our current 2500 members? I believe it is because we, YOU and I, haven't gotten the word out to our former (now retired) colleagues that we need them. Sure we have fun, we give scholarships, we help children, etc. But most important – we are the advocacy group that stands up for our pensions and benefits.

In summary, we need you to recruit additional members. To advocate for you and your colleagues we need a strong and growing membership. Help us help ourselves by recruiting a new member this month.
