

Once again, we are encouraging students to participate in the Montgomery County Public Libraries (MCPL) Summer Reading Program called *A Universe of Stories* (see flyer on the back). Finally, we have provided questions below for both literary and informational text that you can ask your child. They can respond orally or through writing; this is a great way to open up a discussion about a book they read and/or to practice their written reading response skills.

Suggested Verbal/Written Reading Response Questions

Literary Text

- Who is the main character?
- What is the setting in the story? Does the setting change?
- What is the problem/solution?
- Did the character change in the story? How?
- How are you like one of the characters in the story?
- What do you predict will happen next?
- Is it a good title for the story? Why or why not?
- Which part of the story was the most exciting? Why?
- Which parts of the story could/could not really happen?
- How could you change the ending to this story?
- If you could write a sequel to this story, what would it be about?

Non-Fiction Text

- What is the main idea of the text?
- Share something you already knew about the topic before you started to read the text.
- Find three key words that are important to the text.
- What are 2 new words that you learned by reading this text? What do those words mean?
- What are 2 questions you still have about this topic?
- How did the text features (diagrams, captions, maps, etc.) make it easier for you to understand the text?
- What would be another good title for this text?
- What questions would you ask the author about this topic?
- Did you like this text? Why or why not?
