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| <p style="text-align: center;">Sentence Application</p> <p>Use each of your words in a sentence. Make sure the sentence helps to show the meaning of the word.</p> <p>Ex. It was <u>hot</u> outside so I didn't wear a jacket. Not acceptable: I'm <u>hot</u>.</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">Define the Word</p> <p>Define the words that are in your sort. You can either define in your own words or use a dictionary to look up the true definition.</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">Synonyms/Antonyms</p> <p>Find synonyms or antonyms for each of your spelling words. Not all words have a synonym or antonym, so check with an adult if you can't figure one out.</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">Use Words in a Website</p> <p>A fun way to practice spelling is to use the games at www.spellingcity.com (ask an adult first!). When using the website, you will have to type in your list of word</p> |
| <p style="text-align: center;">Highlight the Pattern</p> <p>Write each word in pencil. Ex. soil Find the feature of the word being studied and highlight it in crayon. Ex. <u>soil</u></p> | <p style="text-align: center;">Story Time</p> <p>Use at least 10 of your words to write a story. Your story should have a beginning, middle, and end.</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">Use Words in a Website</p> <p>A fun way to practice spelling is to use the games at www.spellingcity.com (ask an adult first!). When using the website, you will have to type in your list of words</p> | <p style="text-align: center;">Classify</p> <p>Classify your words into different parts of speech such as nouns, verbs, and adjectives.</p> <p>*Use a dictionary to help you!*</p> |
