Immunization Requirements for the 2021-2022 School Year (English and Spanish): All students must have up to date immunization records prior to the start of the 2021-2022 school year. Parents should contact their doctor to make sure their child is properly immunized and submit a copy of the documentation to the Health Room at your child's school as soon as possible, but no later than **Monday, August, 30, 2021** the first day of the 2021-2022 school year. Immunizations for students new to MCPS and children in Kindergarten through Grade 12, are available Monday through Friday, by appointment, at locations in Rockville and Germantown.

3. Have your child's pre-school teacher or child care provided complete the following form to provide information on **Kindergarten Readiness Checklist for 2021-2022:** <u>https://forms.gle/vHx1fsRVEeJtNrPg9</u>

This form should be completed by your child's current child care provider or pre-school/nursery school teacher. If your child does not attend a pre-school or child care, the parent can complete the checklist to the best of their knowledge. Please complete this form by May 29, 2021. The checklist will help us get to know your child's learning experiences, strengths and areas of need. For the child care provider or pre-school teacher, please read each statement and indicate your child's abilities by checking the appropriate column.

We will kick off orientation with a registration drive in April. Formal visits to the school or opportunities to hear more specifics about your child's kindergarten experience will occur with each local school in August, 2021. Per Maryland State Department of Education regulations, to be eligible to enter kindergarten for the 2020-2021 school year, children must be five years of age by September 1, 2020. Children who will turn five years old between September 2 and October 15, 2020 are eligible for consideration for the early entrance to kindergarten process.

• Parents/guardians of children who wish to apply for early entrance to kindergarten must complete the Application for Early Entrance to Kindergarten form.

Return the completed form to your school. Applications for early entrance to kindergarten for the 2020-2021 school year will be accepted from February 1 through June 30, 2020. The testing for Early Entrance to Kindergarten will occur in August. More information will be shared soon.

Diamond Elementary Arts Program June Newsletter

What is going on in Art class during May?

K -2nd Grade— Students will be redesigning public spaces and drawing an underwater scene based on the book Big Al by Andrew Clemins Yoshi.

3rd - 5th Grade— Students will create anime people and animals based on characters that already exist or ones that they make up.

What is going on in Music class during the month of June?

Kindergarten—Students will sing within a limited vocal range and sing songs that use the voice in a variety of ways. Students will identify long/short and high/low sounds through movement. Students will maintain the steady beat through movement and homemade shaker/scraper or body percussion.

1st Grade—Students will be working on reading simple rhythm and pitch patterns. Students will notate simple rhythm patterns. Students will arrange sounds to create ostinato patterns to enhance a given melody.

2nd Grade—Students will be working on composing a simple rhythm pattern and notating it using iconic or standard notation. Students will perform dances to songs from various cultures and time periods.

3rd Grade—Students will notate simple rhythm and/or pitch patterns. Students will use the recorder and building bricks to improvise phrases.

4th Grade—Students will conduct music with meter in three and four. Students will compose and notate simple melodies using a given rhythm.

5th Grade—Students will read and perform a simple melodies or rhythms. Students will compose and notate a short rhythmic pattern.

What is going on in Instrumental Music class during June?

4th and 5th Grade: Students will record themselves playing along to their Final Performance song found in the myMCPS classroom.

What is going on in Physical Education class during June?

Kindergarten through 5th grade— By the end of June students will be able to demonstrate what they've learned throughout the year in P.E. Class.
