# **Literacy**

This month, in literacy, we are working on the theme: Imagine It, Make It. The students will be learning to demonstrate an understanding of basic features of print. They will learn to recognize upper and lower case letters of the alphabet and letter sounds. Our goal is for all students to be able to identify all 52 letters and 26 letter sounds. Students who have

mastered the 52 letters and 26 letter sounds are working in small groups on guided reading. Please continue to work with your child at home with letter identification and letter sounds. We are completing letter, picture, and word sorts.

# **Math**

This month, in math, the students will identify written numerals 0-20. The students who have mastered 0-20 are working on 0-50 and 0-100. They will verbally count to 10 by ones and then work on counting to 20,

50, and 100. Our goal is to have all students count to 100 and identify all the numerals from 0-100. Students will also be identifying simple shapes, sorting, measuring, and comparing lengths. Our goal is to have all students count from 0 to 100.
