## **Literacy**

This month, in literacy, we are completing the theme: <u>Moving On.</u> The students will continue to demonstrate an understanding of basic features of print and text information. Students have learned to recognize upper and lower case letters of the alphabet and continue to work on letter sounds. All students have reached the goal to be able to identify all 52

uppercase and lowercase letters. We are working on mastering their letter sounds. They are also identifying words in a sentence. We are writing sentences and working on guided reading.

## <u>Math</u>

This month, in math, the students will identify written numerals 0-100. They will verbally count to 10 by ones and then develop rote counting to 100 by ones. Our goal is to have all students count to 100 and identify all the numerals from 1-100. Our students are also working on writing the




numerals 0-100. Students will also be identifying simple shapes, sorting, measuring, and comparing lengths. We will also be working on addition, subtraction and addition/subtraction story problems.
