Literacy

This month, in literacy, we are completing the theme: Nature All Around Us. The students will continue to demonstrate an understanding of basic features of print and text information. Students have learned to recognize upper and lower case letters of the alphabet and continue to work on letter sounds. Our goal is for all students to be able to identify all 52 letters and

their sounds. They are also identifying words in sentences. We are writing sentences and working on guided reading. Rhyming is a concept we focus on daily, as well as, answering questions, and having conversations.

Math

This month, in math, the students will identify written numerals 0-100. They will verbally count to 10 by ones and then develop rote counting to 100 by ones. Our goal is to have all students count to 100 and identify all the numerals from 1-100 Students will also be identifying 2 dimensional



and 3 dimensional shapes, sorting, measuring, and comparing lengths. We will also be working on addition, subtraction and addition and subtraction word problems.
