Literacy

This month, in literacy, we are studying the theme: <u>Ready for School</u>. The students will be learning about rules, routines, and our Caring School Community Program. The students will be learning to demonstrate an understanding of basic features of print. They will learn to recognize uppercase and lowercase letters of the alphabet beginning with their

own name. Our goal

is for all students to identify the 52 letters of the alphabet.

<u>Math</u>

This month, in math, the students will identify written numerals 0-10. They will verbally count to 10 by ones and then develop rote counting to 20 by ones. Our goal is to have all students count to 10 and identify all

the numerals from 1-10. Students will also be sorting, and creating and recognizing patterns. Our goal is to have all students count from 1 to 100.
