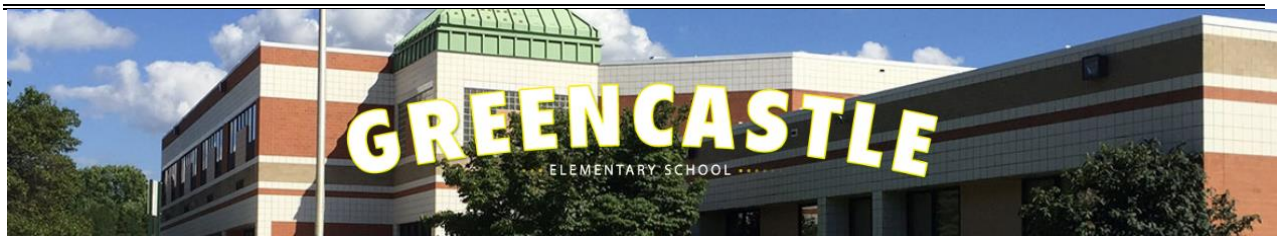
### **ARRIVAL TIME AND PROCEDURES**

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We wanted to clarify our morning arrival procedures:

- Students should not be dropped off before 8:40 a.m. We do not have staff available to monitor students until that time, and we need to be able to ensure everyone's safety.
- Students line up on the blacktop as they arrive. In case of inclement weather, we hold indoor lineup in the gym. Lines begin to proceed to classrooms when the bell rings at 8:45 a.m.
- All students must be in their classroom by 9:00 a.m.
- Students who arrive after the bell rings at 9:00 a.m. must first come to the main office to obtain a late pass before heading to class. Recently, we have begun to see some students come to the blacktop after 9:00. While we welcome late arrivers with open arms, those students will now be directed to the main office first before going to class.
- Students arriving after 9:00 should enter through the front doors *with a parent* so the parent can sign the student in.
- Classroom teachers submit their attendance to the main office before 9:15 a.m.

Timeliness is important so students do not miss morning routines and the beginning of their instructional day. Please help to set your child up for a successful day by ensuring they are on time.



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## **FARMS UPDATE**

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A huge thank you to everyone who turned in an application for Free and Reduced Meals (FARMS) during our push for this earlier in the fall! As a result of everyone's efforts, we have a significant increase in our school's FARMS percentage. Our official percentage for this school year, as shown by our data on October 31<sup>st</sup>, is 67.68%. This is a gain of over eight percentage points from last year's data of 59.29%, which is fantastic!

From here, we await word from MCPS to see if this gain is enough for Greencastle to become a Title I school next year. We will keep you updated as we hear additional information.

## **LOST AND FOUND**

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Over the past few weeks as students have started bringing warmer clothing for recess, we have seen our Lost and Found grow exponentially (see below).

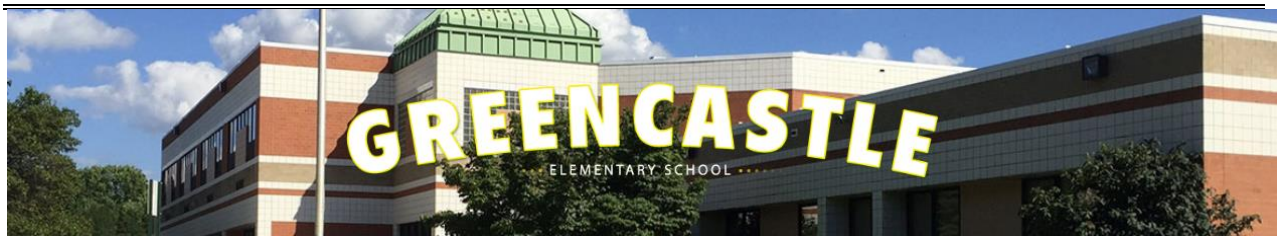

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Winter weather is coming soon. MCPS offers numerous ways for parents to learn about school closures, delayed openings, and early dismissals due to inclement weather.

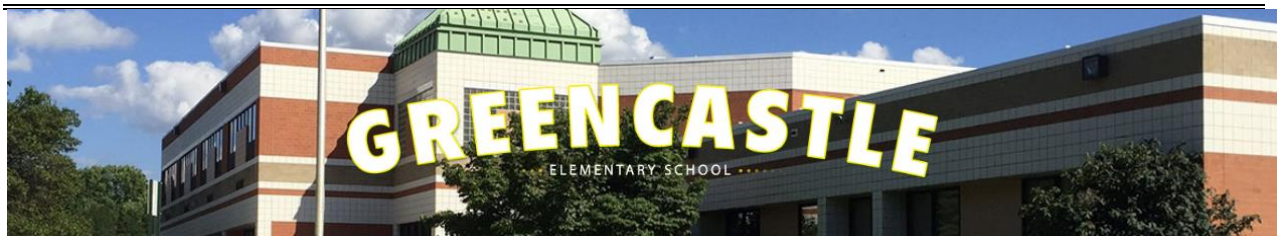

## **STEP TEAM**

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The Greencastle Royalty Steppers Step Team will begin tryouts the first week of February. 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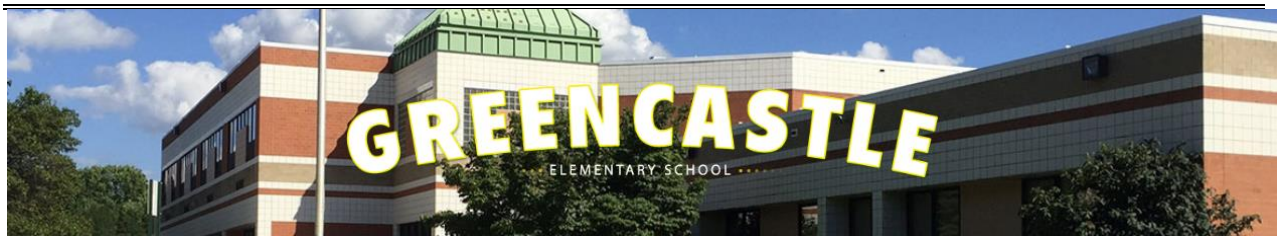

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The MCPS Districtwide Boundary Analysis is an initiative designed to provide a comprehensive assessment of Montgomery County Public School boundaries by analyzing factors such as:

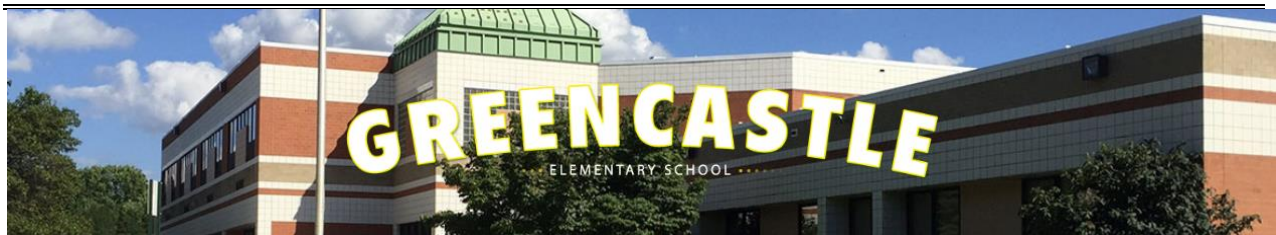
- School facility utilization and capacity
- Student demographics
- School assignment
- Travel patterns

This initiative will result in an analytical assessment and a summary of the community engagement process. It will not make recommendations on potential boundary revisions.

As part of this assessment, a series of regional public meetings will be held in six locations around the county in December and January. All residents of Montgomery County are invited to attend to learn more about the Boundary Analysis process and give feedback on opportunities and challenges with our public schools. Each meeting will have the same format and content. The dates and locations of the meetings are as follows:

- December 4 at Gaithersburg High School
- December 11 at Julius West Middle School
- December 14 at White Oak Middle Oak
- January 7 at Walter Johnson High School
- January 11 at Montgomery Blair High School
- January 14 at Northwest High School

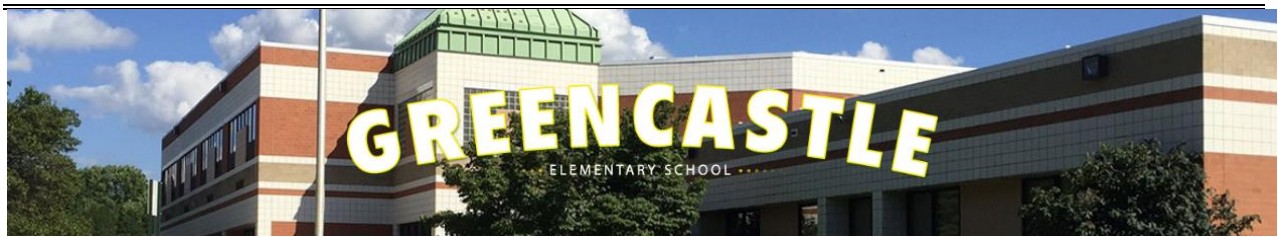

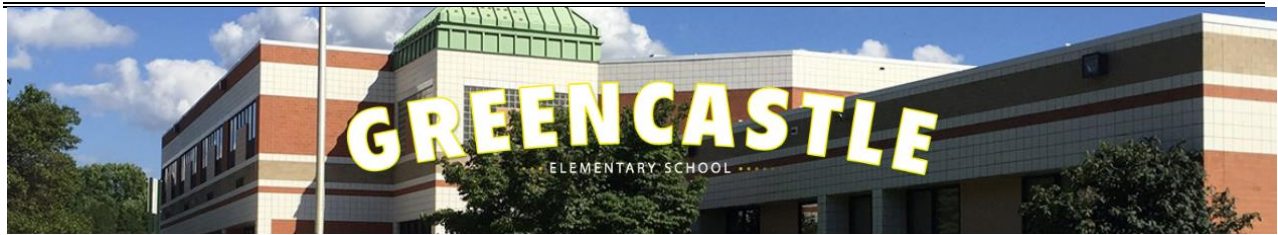
## **ANNUAL USED CAR, COMPUTER SALE COMING DECEMBER 7**
