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## Math Focus

We are continuing our work with Module 3 which builds directly on students' work with multiplication and division in Module 1. Module 3 extends the study of factors from 2, 3, 4, 5, and 10 to include all units from 0 to 10, as well as multiples of 10 within 100. We will wrap up Module 3 right before Winter Break. Please make sure your child comes to school that last two days before break as they have to take the required End of Module Assessment.

# Reading and Writing Focus

Students will start working on Unit 3: Animal Adaptations. Students are working toward answering the Essential Question, how do living things adapt to change? In this unit, students will read and compare selections to learn about animal adaptations. In writing, students are writing an informative news report about a specific animals adaptations and how they help that animal survive.

# Science and Social Studies Focus

We will be doing Social Studies Module 2 at the beginning of December. In Module 2, students will learn about multiple perspectives of decision-making to protect/modify the environment. In mid-December, students will move on to Unit 2 of Science. In Unit 2, students begin their study of weather and climate phenomena through an exploration of cloud types and the water cycle. Continuing the study of weather phenomena, students will determine what causes the water in clouds to fall as rain and other forms of precipitation. Students extend their understanding of weather to explore climate zones and describe differences among areas; they also combine information to describe climates in different regions of the country. Students extend their understanding of weather to explore four examples of severe weather (blizzard, thunderstorm, tornado, and hurricane).
