If a TWO HOUR DELAY is announced, our students should arrive to school no earlier than 10:40 a.m. If a TWO AND a HALF HOUR EARLY RELEASE is announced, our students will be dismissed at 12:55 p.m. If your child goes to Kids After Hours, please check with them to learn about their policy regarding inclement weather.

Also, if the temperature is 32 degrees or warmer, with the wind chill factored, our students will be outside for outdoor recess. Please make sure that your children come to school with warm winter outer wear so they are comfortable outside. If the temperature is under 32 degrees, the students will remain inside for indoor recess.

Districtwide Boundary Analysis Meetings

Several meetings will be held around the county in December and January for members of the community to participate in conversations about the Districtwide Boundary Analysis. The MCPS Districtwide Boundary Analysis is an initiative designed to provide a comprehensive assessment of Montgomery County Public Schools' boundaries by analyzing factors such as: School facility utilization and capacity, Student demographics, School assignment, and Travel patterns. This initiative will result in an analytical assessment and a summary of the community engagement process. It will not make recommendations on potential boundary revisions. The meetings will follow the same program. The meeting will feature brief presentations that share basic information about the issues to be discussed during the boundary analysis and, after each presentation, there will be an opportunity to provide feedback during facilitated table discussions. Maryland Report Card

The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) has released the results of the 2019 Accountability System, the Maryland Report Card for every school in the state of Maryland. The report card for Montgomery County Public Schools can be found at <a href="mailto:reportcard.msde.maryland.gov/Graphs/#/ReportCards/Repor

The Maryland Report Card is designed to evaluate school success in several ways, measuring state test results in English Language Arts and math; postsecondary readiness; progress of English learners in achieving English language proficiency; graduation rate;

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and students with access to and earning credit for a well-rounded curriculum. While the Maryland Report Card does provide important information about our schools, it provides a limited view of the progress of our more than 165,000 students.

To better understand how our schools are serving all of our students, MCPS has developed an Equity Accountability Model that provides a more detailed and focused report of school success. The Equity Accountability Model uses multiple and frequent measures of students' progress to determine if a school is meeting the needs of all students, with a special emphasis on reducing and eliminating disparities in student achievement. Draft Policy IGS, *Educational Technology*, reaffirms the Board's commitment to equitable access and opportunity for all students and staff to use technology to communicate, collaborate, create and innovate safely and responsibly in support of teaching and learning.
