### **New Lice Procedures**

Please see the latest updates regarding lice:

- 1. Students identified with likely lice infestation can stay in school for the rest of the school day. Treatment is required prior to the student coming to school the next school day. Parent/guardians will need to bring their child to the health room for inspection and to ensure treatment was done.
- 2. A student is considered to have an infestation with head lice if live lice and/or viable nits are observed. Non-viable nits are more than ¼ inch from the scalp. This guidance has been updated from the previous ½ inch.
