

## Eureka Math Focus

We will begin Module 6 upon return from Spring Break. We will build on concepts about data, graphing, and line plots. Topic A begins with a lesson in which students generate categorical data, organize it, and then represent it in a variety of forms. We will finish up Topic A by solving one and two step word problems.


Develop habits that will help us Lead Others, such as; Think Win-Win, Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood, Synergize, and Sharpen the Saw.

Students we will focus on the measurement topic: Economics. In Module 1, students learn about what budgets include and how they help people make financial decisions. Students will also read a text to learn different ways money can be earned to save for an expense. This lays a foundation for Module 2 when students will examine how businesses (producers) also use budgets to make financial decisions about the natural, human, and capital resources they use to produce goods and services for consumers.

Communities Then and Now. In this unit, students will read nonfiction texts and compare selections about different types of communities to understand what a community is. Students will focus on the essential question "What is a community?"
