We are thrilled to welcome our new Washington Grove students and their families to our first year of learning together. And, of course, we cannot wait to see our returning students and families.

Washington Grove is **PROUD** to be a **DUAL LANGUAGE** school. MCPS staff have been working with school teams to align the organizational structures and practices across the 6 Dual Language schools. Some aspects of our program will change, including focused instruction of each content in one language. What will not change is that students in grades K - 5 and two sections of Pre-K will spend half their day learning in Spanish and half their day learning English. Students will continue to receive literacy instruction in both languages daily. The three pillars of Dual Language Education remain as a guide for our work.

School attendance is essential for student learning. Students who miss even two days of school a month miss over 10% of overall instruction. Please make attendance at school a priority for your child and family. If you need help with this, please reach out to Sra. Hernández, Sra. Guardado or myself.

Our school hours are 9:25 a.m. – 3:50 p.m. Students should arrive at school at 9:10 a.m. That is when we open the doors and welcome your children to school daily. For the safety of your children, do not drop them off at school before 9:10 a.m. because there is NO adult supervision.

Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) will provide free breakfast and lunch at Washington Grove in the 2023–2024 school year. Households do NOT need to complete Free And Reduced-price Meal (FARMS) applications in order to receive free meal benefits at our school*. We encourage students to enjoy breakfast and lunch at school; please check out the menus <u>here</u>. *Households with students at other MCPS schools should check directly with those schools to determine if a FARM application is needed.

Summer is always a time of change; with that change comes staffing updates. I am very excited about the team we have collaboratively built to work with our students this year. They are a group of dynamic, student-focused, and passionate educators ready to create an amazing chapter in the lives of our students. Homeroom Assignments

We will post your child's homeroom assignments for the 2023-2024 school year outside of school on Wednesday, August 23, 2023.

Patrol Meeting

A patrol meeting will be held at 5:30 p.m. on Thursday, August 24, 2023, in the cafeteria. All grade 5 students who will serve as Washington Grove patrols are required to attend this important informational meeting.

Students Arriving Late

Students who arrive in the school building after 9:25 a.m. are marked tardy. Students who arrive late must go directly to the office, sign in, and receive a late pass. Each late arrival counts as a tardy.

Dropping Off and Picking Up Students

Students being dropped off in the Kiss & Learn area MUST exit their cars using the passenger side door. Adults in the car should remain inside the car in this area. Cars may not be left unattended. If you would like to walk your student to the doors, please park your car on Oakmont Street and walk them down.

Picking Up Your Child Early From School

In order to ensure continuity and avoid/minimize disruptions during the instructional day, parents should avoid picking up students before 3:50 p.m. If you need to pick up your child before the end of the school day, please do so by 3:30 p.m.

Bus schedules are being finalized and will be sent separately.

Changes in Transportation or Location

It is important for the safety of students that we are notified if your child's arrival or dismissal plan changes. Students **ARE REQUIRED** to bring a note indicating the change (For example, "Maria Gonzalez will go to S.O.A.R. after school today, Monday, September 15th. Sincerely, Mrs. Gonzalez"). Your signature is always required for this change. Any changes that are emailed must be sent to the classroom teacher and the main office (Monica_M_Benitez@mcpsmd.org and Michelle_A_Robey@mcpsmd.org).

Student Item Drop Off

Students need to be prepared with their materials each day. If you need to drop off your child's items, please leave them with Ms. Monica Benitez in the main office. She will make sure that the materials are given to your child.

Updating Emergency Information - SYNERGY

Please be sure to update your family's information on SYNERGY by the end of the second week of school. Ensure that you provide emergency contact information (including names, phone and email) for those people who are authorized to pick up your child in case you are unable. **Children will not be released to any adult whose name does not appear in Synergy. Please remind them to bring a picture ID with them to match.** If you need help with this task, please reach out to Sra. Benitez or Sra. De La Cruz.

Families can send in a small store-bought birthday treat for each class member to help celebrate their student. Balloons, goodie bags, juice, and pizza parties are not allowed. Treats will be handed out during student lunch
