Dear Clarksburg High School Families:

It is my sincere hope that this letter finds you and your family doing well, in good health and spirit while enjoying the final weeks of summer. It is not optimistic of me to assume that you have had a wonderful time with family and friends and that you have managed to stay cool during the hot weather we have had. On behalf of the entire Clarksburg High School staff, I would like to welcome you to the beginning of what is going to be a wonderful 2021-2022 school year! Clarksburg High School will be open at 100 percent capacity, five-day-a-week learning, for all students this fall. We have been diligently working this summer to plan for the school year and prepare a second home for your wonderful children - all 2,335+ of them!

It's been quite a while since our students were last in the building as a full school. It will be our goal to create new traditions while establishing and reinforcing past traditions of excellence. To accomplish our goal of EXCELLENCE, the Instructional Leadership Team has used school data, student, parent and staff feedback to develop a blueprint that provides students additional opportunities to be successful in all levels of instruction using a differentiated instructional approach. Our plan is to highlight positive relationships with whole child education as the norm. As we delve into an instructional focus through the lens of cultural relevance, we will engage in our shared belief that every individual contributes to our school community. We want our students to strive toward college and career readiness. We must prepare them for the demands of the 21st century global environment, emphasizing the mastery of critical thinking skills.

Speaking of college and career readiness, we have received results from the College Board regarding our students' participation and performance on Advanced Placement (AP) exams. This past May, 718 students took one or more of the 1,176 AP exams we administered remotely and in person. While it is disappointing that our participation rate <u>decreased</u> by 634 exams from the previous year due to the pandemic, I am proud of the students for taking on the challenge. **Over 460 students earned scores of 3 or higher, or 64% of the total AP students had scores of 3 or higher.** Scores at this level often yield opportunities for credit at colleges and universities throughout our region and our nation.

As we return to campus, all MCPS students, staff, and visitors will be required to wear face coverings in school buildings this fall, regardless of vaccination status. This decision aligns with recommendations by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the American Academy of Pediatrics, as well as local health officials. MCPS must ensure the safety of all students and staff as it prepares for a return to in-person instruction five days a week. Masking requirements will be reviewed regularly and is subject to change as the district reviews guidance from federal, state and local health officials. Face coverings are not required outdoors but are strongly recommended for unvaccinated individuals.

Please also make note of our school dress code. A dress code encourages students to express their individuality through personality and academic achievements, not outward appearances. A dress code puts the focus on academics, not fashion, because it projects a neat, serious, businesslike image. Respectful behavior is also a determiner of success and we encourage students to relate well to each other, to work hard, the ability to stand up for oneself and others for the right reasons, and knowledge of how to control emotions. Additionally, I must stress the importance of on time attendance to all classes every class period, every day. Finally, please encourage students to continue to express school pride and spirit by supporting their peers, school events, school athletics, and our Clarksburg community. Please help lead these efforts by your own example.

The remainder of this letter includes information to help you prepare for the 2021-2022 school year. Please read the information under each category heading carefully. The information provided in this summer packet is our one consistent communication vehicle that reaches every home. #### FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

The first day of school for students is Monday, August 30, 2021 classes begin at 7:45 am.

Suggested early arrival time is 7:20-7:30 am. Students accessing MCPS school buses will enter school via the CHS bus loop. *Students should know their bus route number for arrival and departure, as well as their home address and major cross streets in case they need to look up bus route information*. # ATTENDANCE POLICY

Academic success begins with excellent attendance. Therefore, special attention will be paid to the issue of attendance and punctuality. We expect every student to be in school every day except for the legitimate reasons defined by Maryland State law and listed below:

- Death in the immediate family
- Certified illness of the student
- Court summons
- Work or activity accepted by school authorities
- Observance of religious holiday

- Quarantine
- Physical and mental incapacity
- Violent storms
- State emergency

When a student is absent, a signed note by a parent or guardian must be turned in to Ms. Koval in the Attendance Office within 3 days of returning to school for the absence to be excused. Notes for early dismissal must be presented to the Attendance Office prior to the start of the school day. We respectfully request that, when possible, doctor appointments are made for the after-school hours and on days when there is not school. Likewise, please pay careful attention to the enclosed school calendar and schedule vacations and college visits for the times that school is not in session. Students who miss class assignments due to an unexcused tardy or absence will not receive grades or credit for those missed assignments. Students will remain responsible for the content of those assignments, as they prepare for summative assessments.

# **LUNCH POLICY**

NEW: All meals will be provided free of charge during the 2021-2022 school year. MCPS will continue to provide breakfast, lunch and dinner meals to all students in schools and at designated food distribution sites. It is recommended that families still complete the 2021-2022 FARMS application that is now available online. Here is the link: <a href="https://www.MySchoolApps.com">www.MySchoolApps.com</a>. If you need assistance completing the online form, please contact your student's counselor.

All students will eat lunch during one 41-minute session following the 4th class period. Students will use ID Cards to order from the cafeteria. Students may eat in the cafeteria or in classrooms that are supervised by a teacher or member of the Clarksburg High School staff. Students may also eat in one of our three outdoor courtyards if weather permits. The courtyards represent a privilege, and students are expected to maintain the grounds impeccably during lunch or they will simply lose the opportunity to eat within them. Students may not eat nor assemble in any stairwells during the lunch period. Students may not leave school grounds during lunch without parent consent and administrator approval. Students may not make mobile delivery orders to Clarksburg High School.

The 41-minute lunch session is also designed to promote opportunities for <u>academic support</u> and for <u>club participation</u>. Teachers will be available for students to visit for small group tutoring, re-teaching, and reassessment. All students are expected to seek assistance from their teachers on a regular basis and strive to achieve at least a 3.0 grade-point average.

# PORTABLE COMMUNICATION DEVICES (PCDs)

Students will be permitted to use their PCDs <u>before school</u>, <u>during lunch</u>, <u>and after school</u> throughout the facility. Students will be expected to practice proper etiquette, keeping cell phone ring tones silent or on vibrate. Students will use earbuds when listening to music devices during the time listed above. At other times earbuds should be away.

After careful deliberation by the Instructional Council, we have decided to provide our teachers with more flexibility regarding the instructional use of PCDs within the classroom. This year, as has been customary, <u>teachers</u> will be able to decide if and when it is appropriate for students to use the PCDs to support their learning in the classroom. Teachers will reserve the right to restrict use of PCDs as well. Students who consistently fail to adhere to the PCD policy will have their phones confiscated by an administrator or security team member. Confiscated phones will be available for pick up by a parent or guardian once a week on Thursday afternoons from 2:30 to 4:00 pm.

#### **ID BADGES**

All students will be issued ID badges at no cost and **these badges should be carried at all times.** Students will need to show their ID to receive or use school services, including purchasing lunch. Students who lose, break, or deface their ID's will have to pay a replacement cost of \$5.00 per new card.

#### STUDENT AGENDA BOOK

During the first week of school, each 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade student will receive a student agenda book that contains a school calendar, policies and procedures, and other important information. **Parents and guardians should read it and review it with their children.** This agenda book will answer most questions about the school and its workings. Students should carry this agenda book with them throughout the school year. Students who lose their agenda book will have to pay a replacement cost of \$5.00 per new book.

### SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST

All students will be provided with a Chromebook and carry case (Students returning to an MCPS school were provided with Chromebooks that shall be used this upcoming year - grades 9, 11, and 12 will be provided with updated Chromebooks). All other necessary school supplies will be reviewed during the first week of school by classroom teachers, and students and parents will be notified of school supplies that are necessary. Textbooks, supplementary readers, audio/visual aid, stationery, and materials of instruction necessary to teach the curriculum or needed by the students shall be provided.

Personal supplies for all students are recommended but **optional** and include the following:

<u>Personal Supplies</u>: Backpack, Wide ruled loose-leaf notebook paper, 1 set 8 subject dividers, pencil pouch with three holes, black/blue pens, #2 pencils with erasers, and glue sticks

#### **LOCKERS**

Lockers will be distributed to 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students during Homeroom. Due to enrollment beyond our facility's capacity, lockers will be optional for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students. Lockers will be issued to 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students on a first come, first served basis through the Business Office.

#### 3. Medication requirements for 2021-2022 School Year:

All medications at school require an authorization form to be completed by a healthcare provider and parent/guardian. This pertains to all prescription, over the counter and emergency medications kept in the health room or self-carried by students. Links to these forms are contained in section 2, above. Parents/guardians are requested to call the health room prior to dropping off medications and forms so we can arrange to meet you.

#### 4. Immunization Requirements for 2021-2022 School Year:

All students must have up to date immunization records prior to the start of the 2021-2022 school year. Parents should contact their doctor to make sure their child is properly immunized and submit a copy of the documentation to the Health Room at your child's school as soon as possible, but no later than **Monday**, **August 30**, **2021** the first day of the 2021-2022 school year.

Immunizations for students new to MCPS and children in Kindergarten through Grade 12, are available Monday through Friday, by appointment, at locations in Rockville and Germantown.

5. **Asthma & Allergies**: Please complete and submit a <u>Student Asthma Management Plan (SAMP)</u> and <u>Allergy Form</u> if your child has asthma and/or allergies. #### PSAT: PRELIMINARY SAT/NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP OUALIFYING TEST

The PSAT will be offered to all Grade 10 and Grade 11 students on October 13, 2021, at no cost to students. Because current Grade 11 students did not have the opportunity to take the PSAT in Grade 10 as a result of the pandemic, the test will be offered at no cost for both Grade 10 and Grade 11 students this year. In order to receive accommodations on these tests, a student must request the accommodations by submitting a Student Eligibility Form. The form must be completed by both parents and school officials and then mailed to the College Board at least seven weeks in advance of the student taking the first test.

The criteria established by the College Board for granting testing accommodations differs significantly from those used by Montgomery County Public Schools. Students who have an Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) or a 504 Plan are not guaranteed that the College Board will provide accommodations. The College Board requires current neuropsychological testing (within the past three years) which documents the specific need for each requested accommodation. Please contact the Counseling Office (240-740-6020) in order to obtain the forms and to ask questions about this process.
