Dear Clarksburg High School Families:

I hope this letter finds you doing well and in good health and spirit while you are enjoying the final weeks of summer. It is not optimistic of me to assume that you have had a wonderful time with family and friends and that you have managed to stay cool and dry during the hot and wet weather we have had this summer. On behalf of the entire Clarksburg High School staff, I would like to welcome you to the beginning of what is going to be a wonderful 2019-2020 school year! We have been diligently working hard this summer to plan for the school year and prepare a second home for your wonderful children - all 2,473 + of them!

To accomplish our goal of EXCELLENCE, the Instructional Leadership Team has used school data, student, parent and staff feedback to develop a blueprint that provides students additional opportunities to be successful in all levels of instruction using a differentiated instructional approach. Whole child education will be the norm as we delve into an instructional focus using the lens of cultural relevancy, engaging in our shared belief that every individual contributes to our school community. We want our students to strive toward college and career readiness. We must prepare them for the demands of the 21st Century global environment, emphasizing the mastery of critical thinking skills.

Speaking of college and career readiness, I have great news to report to you regarding our students' participation and performance on Advanced Placement (AP) exams. We have received results from the College Board. This past May, 922 students took one or more of the 1,785 AP exams we administered. While our participation rate increased by 255 exams from the previous year, our performance on the exams remained exemplary. **Over 868 students earned scores of 3 or higher, or 70% of the total AP students had scores of 3 or higher.** Scores at this level often yield opportunities for credit at colleges and universities throughout our region and our nation.

This increase is directly related to our collaborative efforts as a school community. Our staff, students, and parents came together to formulate a comprehensive Advanced Placement instructional plan. We met monthly with a committee of teachers, counselors, and administrators to review and adjust the plan. We will continue this work as part of the Equal Opportunity Schools cohort which you can learn more about here: <http://eoschools.org>

Please also make note of our school dress code. A dress code encourages students to express their individuality through personality and academic achievements, not outward appearances. A dress code puts the focus on academics, not fashion, because it projects a neat, serious, businesslike image. Student respectful behavior is also a determiner of success and we encourage students to relate well to each other, to work hard, to stand up for oneself and others for the right reasons, and use knowledge of how to control emotions. Additionally, I must stress the importance of on time attendance to all classes every class period, every day. Finally, please encourage students to continue to express school pride and spirit by supporting their peers, school events, school athletics, and our Clarksburg community. Please help lead these efforts by your own example.

The remainder of this letter includes information to help you prepare for the 2019-2020 school year. Please read the information under each category heading carefully. The information provided in this summer packet is our one consistent communication vehicle that reaches every home. NINTH GRADE and NEW STUDENT & PARENT ORIENTATION SESSIONS

We will be hosting an orientation session for all 9th grade students and students at other grade levels new to CHS on **Thursday, August 29, 2019 from 7:45 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.** This will be the first opportunity for students to visit with us, learn their daily schedule, and meet their classroom teachers. We expect all 9th grade students to attend. We will also conduct an Activities Club Fair to promote student organizations and encourage participation. **MCPS Bus transportation will be provided on August 29, 2019.** A letter from our MCPS transportation supervisor and a listing of the bus stops and routes for Clarksburg High School have been included for your review. Students should arrive at the bus stop five minutes prior to the start time listed on the bus route document and ride the bus to and from Clarksburg High School on the day of the orientation.

We will also conduct an orientation session for all parents of 9th grade students and those new to CHS during the evening of **August 29, 2019 from 7:00 – 8:30 p.m.** Please make plans to join us that evening to learn more about your child's experience at Clarksburg High School. The CHS Boosters will be selling Freshman "Class of 2023" t-shirts as well as Clarksburg Spirit wear at the Freshman Parent Orientation. The "Class of 2023" t-shirts are Coyote Blue which can be used in PE classes. We accept cash, checks, or credit card payments. (Bring your checkbook!!)

On Wednesday, August 21, 2019 from 7:00 – 8:30 p.m. in the auditorium, we will be conducting our annual "Fall Meet the Coaches" Night. This required meeting is an opportunity for the parents of our student-athletes to talk with the coaches of our fall sports teams and learn about the policies and procedures associated with athletics at Clarksburg High School. FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL

The first day of school for students is **Tuesday, September 3, 2019 beginning at 7:45 am.** Students will report to their Homerooms, organized alphabetically by grade level. We will have members of our Student Government Association (SGA), our Coyote Ambassadors, and other student leaders available that morning to assist students as they navigate the hallways to find their Homeroom assignment. We will also have the Homeroom listings posted throughout the school.

Students will also be asked to sign the Technology Code of Ethics. This document outlines expectations students must follow while accessing computer software and internet programs at Clarksburg High School. A copy of the Technology Code of Ethics is on our website for your review. Please take the time to emphasize to your child the importance of safe and sound decision making while using the computer and partner with us to ensure a safe and positive cyber learning environment for all of our students. **Once a student has signed and returned the Technology Code of Ethics, he/she will receive a user id and password.**

BACK TO SCHOOL NIGHT

Mark your calendars for **Thursday, September 5th!** This is one of the most important nights in the school year. Our entire staff will be available to meet with you and discuss our instructional and extracurricular programs. Our administrative team will be on hand for a *Meet and Greet* in the auditorium at 6:30 p.m. and classroom visits will commence at 7:00 p.m.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Academic success begins with excellent attendance. Therefore, special attention will be paid to the issue of attendance and punctuality. We expect every student to be in school every day except for the legitimate reasons defined by Maryland State law and listed below:

- Death in the immediate family
- Certified illness of the student
- Court summons
- Work or activity accepted by school authorities
- Observance of religious holiday
- Quarantine
- Physical and mental incapacity
- Violent storms
- State emergency

When a student is absent, a signed note by a parent or guardian must be turned in to Ms. Koval in the Attendance Office within 3 days of returning to school for the absence to be excused. Notes for early dismissal must be presented to the Attendance Office prior to the start of the school day. We respectfully request that, when possible, doctor appointments are made for the after-school hours and on days when there is not school. Likewise, please pay careful attention to the enclosed school calendar and schedule vacations and college visits for the times that school is not in session. **Students who miss class assignments due to an unexcused tardy or absence will not receive grades or credit for those missed assignments. Students will remain responsible for the content of those assignments, as they prepare for summative assessments.**

LUNCH POLICY

All students will eat lunch during one 41-minute session following 4th period. NEW: Students will use ID Cards to order from the cafeteria. Students may eat in the cafeteria or in classrooms that are supervised by a teacher or member of the Clarksburg High School staff. Students may also eat in one of our three outdoor courtyards if weather permits. The courtyards represent a privilege, and students are expected to maintain the grounds impeccably during lunch or they will simply lose the opportunity to eat within them. **Students may not eat nor assemble in any stairwells during the lunch period. Students may not leave school grounds during lunch without parent consent and administrator approval. Students may not order delivery orders to Clarksburg High School.**

The 41-minute lunch session is also designed to promote opportunities for academic support and for club participation. Teachers will be available for students to visit for small group tutoring, re-teaching, and reassessment. All students are expected to seek assistance from their teachers on a regular basis and strive to achieve at least a 3.0 grade-point average.

PORTABLE COMMUNICATION DEVICES (PCDs)

Students will be permitted to use their PCDs before school, during lunch, and after school throughout the facility. Students will be expected to practice proper etiquette, keeping cell phone ring tones silent or on vibrate. Students will use ear buds when listening to music devices during the time listed above. At other times ear buds should be away.

After careful deliberation by the Instructional Council, we have decided to provide our teachers with more flexibility regarding the instructional use of PCDs within the classroom. This year, as has been customary, **teachers** will be able to decide if and when it is appropriate for students to use the PCDs to support their learning in the classroom. Teachers will reserve the right to restrict use of PCDs as well. Students who consistently fail to adhere to the PCD policy will have their phones confiscated by an administrator or security team member. **Confiscated phones will be available for pick up by a parent or guardian once a week on Thursday afternoons from 2:30 to 4:00 pm.**

ID BADGES

New students will be issued ID badges at no cost and **these badges should be carried at all times.** Students will need to show their ID to receive or use school services, including purchasing lunch. Students who lose, break, or deface their ID's will have to pay a replacement cost of \$5.00 per new card.

STUDENT AGENDA BOOK

During the first week of school, each 9th and 10th grade student will receive a student agenda book that contains a school calendar, policies and procedures, and other important information. **Parents and guardians should read it and review it with their children.** This agenda book will answer most questions about the school and its workings. Students should carry this agenda book with them throughout the school year. Students who lose their agenda book will have to pay a replacement cost of \$5.00 per new book.

PARKING PERMITS APPLICATIONS – SENIORS ONLY

Applications are available for Seniors under the Student tab on-line at our website, www.montgomeryschoolsmd.org/schools/clarksburghs. Applications are due by August 9, 2019. MCPS has a fee of \$37.50 per semester for parking. Seniors will be notified by August 16th if they will be receiving a parking permit.

LOCKERS


