not just the prestigious ones


2. The truth about admissions isn't always pretty, but:

What you do in college will be much more important than whether or not the school is prestigious.

Highly Selective Colleges

- What is a highly selective college?
 - Defined as colleges that *accept fewer than 20%* of all applicants
 - One for which grades alone won't get you in
 - One where **no single student** has a "good chance" of admission

Is there a formula?



A day in the life of an admissions counselor...

- “**This year’s admit rate will be 9%. For every student you admit, you need to let go of ten others.**” – From an admission blog
- Special admit categories: Legacy, athletics, diversity
- International statistics are even lower:
 - Quotas for International students range from 7-12% of all admitted students
- Therefore, international admission rates at HSCs are low, can be 3%



Five qualities admitted students demonstrate:

- **1. Passion**

- Follow what you **actually** love
- Students with passion have the ability to make an impact on campus
- Example: Environmental club to recycling bins

Five qualities admitted students demonstrate:

- **2. Initiative**

- “Is this student going to make things happen when she arrives on campus?”
- Initiative is **not** the same thing as leadership
- Don’t let your parents organize involvements for you!

Five qualities admitted students demonstrate:



- **3. Individuality**
 - Be comfortable with who you are and what you stand for
 - It's ok to be different!
 - Example: Flight simulation! Aquafarming!


Five qualities admitted students demonstrate:

- **4. Love of Learning**

- Don't be a grade grubber- dropping everything in your life to make perfect grades.
- Colleges love students who **actually** enjoy learning new things- and take initiative to learn them!



Five qualities admitted students demonstrate:



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- 5. Likeability/Fit
 - Just be yourself
 - Work hard doing things you love, present yourself honestly, and be confident enough to know that you'll be ok no matter where you go to college

How do Highly Selective Colleges decide who gets in?

- 1. The academic ranking
- 2. The personal ranking

Successful students show their PIILL through both the academic and personal parts of the application.

Test Scores (SAT/ACT)


PERSONAL

The Academic Ranking

- What are the parts?
 1. Course Selection
 2. Class Rank
 3. Grades
 4. Test Scores
- The highest achievers
 - Differentiate themselves with PIILL
 - Ex: Take courses outside of school because they are intellectually curious, not because it “looks good”



The Personal Ranking

1. Activities
2. Essays
3. Matchmaking



The Personal Ranking

1. Activities

- Don't follow the crowd
- Make an impact



The Personal Ranking



2. Essays

- Don't write a McEssay
- Don't try to impress
- Be yourself

The Personal Ranking

4. Matchmaking or “Fit”

- Yield
 - Percentage of admitted students who accept their offer
- Fit becomes crucial
 - Why do universities ask the questions they ask

Letters of Recommendation

Can tell about you as an academic, but also about your character as a community member
