1733/1743	Spanish 3 (H) Prerequisite Spanish 2	Students speak Spanish and use their skills to read literary, historic, cultural, and informational texts, write essays and deliver oral presentations.	
1734/1744	Spanish 4 (H) Prerequisite Spanish 3 or Spanish 3 (H)	Students continue practicing skills attained in the lower levels and further their understanding of Spanish speaking countries and cultures through intensive study.	
1715/1725	Spanish 5 Prerequisite Spanish 4 (H)	An advanced Spanish communications course where the focus is to strengthen communication skills and awareness of the culture and everyday life of Spanish speakers	
1753/1754	IB Spanish 5 Prerequisite Spanish 4 (H) or Spanish for Spanish Speakers 3	An advanced Spanish communications course where the focus is to strengthen communication skills and awareness of the culture and everyday life of Spanish speakers. Preparation for the IB exam.	\$
1716/1717	Spanish 6 Prerequisite Spanish 5	Continuation of the advanced Spanish communications course using everyday situations and media sources to enhance their communication skills.	
1755/1756	IB Spanish 6 Prerequisite IB Spanish 5/ Spanish 5	Continuation of the advanced Spanish communications course using everyday situations and media sources to enhance their communication skills. IB exam preparation	\$
1759/1760	AP Spanish Language Prerequisite Spanish 5 or Spanish for Spanish Speakers 3	The AP Spanish Language and Culture course engages students in an exploration of culture in both contemporary and historical contexts. The course develops students' awareness and appreciation of products, both tangible (e.g., tools, books) and intangible (e.g., laws, conventions, institutions); practices (patterns of social interactions within a culture); and perspectives (values, attitudes, and assumptions that underlie both practices and products).	\$

1660/1664	<p>IB Spanish 7 (HL)</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>IB Spanish 6</i></p>	Prepares students to take the HL IB Spanish exam by continuing with communication skills and including famous Spanish literature. Acceptance in course based on Teacher recommendation.	\$
1777/1778	<p>Spanish for Spanish Speakers 1</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>Placement exam</i></p>	The purpose of this course is to enable students whose heritage language is Spanish to develop, maintain, and enhance proficiency in their heritage language by reinforcing and acquiring skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing, including the fundamentals of Spanish grammar.	
1779/1780	<p>Spanish for Spanish Speakers 2</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>Spanish for Spanish Speakers 1 or placement exam</i></p>	Continued development for heritage language speakers to develop advanced skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing in Spanish.	
1781/1782	<p>Spanish for Spanish Speakers 3</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>Spanish for Spanish Speakers 2 or placement exam</i></p>	Heritage speakers will use their acquired skills and apply them in advanced materials that are used daily and can be transferred to common tasks. This course prepares a student for the AP or IB curriculum.	
1611/1621	<p>French 1</p>	Intro to the French language, geography, and culture. Students will develop a basic ability to understand, read, speak, and write French.	
1612/1622	<p>French 2</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>French 1</i></p>	Students further their understanding of French communication skills with an emphasis on advanced grammar, readings and conversation.	
1633/1643	<p>French 3 (H)</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>French 2</i></p>	Students speak French and use their skills to read literary, historic, cultural, and informational texts, write essays and deliver oral presentations.	
1634/1644	<p>French 4 (H)</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>French 3 or French 3 (H)</i></p>	Students continue practicing skills attained in the lower levels and further their understanding of French speaking countries and cultures through intensive study.	
1615/1625	<p>French 5</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>French 4 (H)</i></p>	An advanced French communications course where the focus is to strengthen communication skills and awareness of the culture and everyday life of French speakers	
1627/1628	<p>IB French 5</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>French 4 (H)</i></p>	An advanced French communications course where the focus is to strengthen communication skills and awareness of the culture and everyday life of French speakers. Preparation for the IB exam	\$
1616/1626	<p>French 6</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>French 5</i></p>	Continuation of the advanced French communications course using everyday situations and media sources to enhance their communication skills.	

1629/1630	<p>IB French 6</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>IB French 5/French 5</i></p>	Continuation of the advanced French communications course using everyday situations and media sources to enhance their communication skills. IB exam preparation	\$
1658/1662	<p>IB French 7</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>IB French 6</i></p>	Continuation of the advanced French communications course using everyday situations and media sources to enhance their communication skills. HL exam preparation. Acceptance in course based on Teacher recommendation.	\$
1596/1597	American Sign Language 1	ASL 1 is an introduction to American Sign Language (ASL). Includes basic grammar, vocabulary, fingerspelling, numbers, and cultural information related to the Deaf Community.	
1593/1594	<p>American Sign Language 2</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>American Sign Language 1</i></p>	ASL 2 is a continuation of ASL 1. Expands vocabulary, grammatical knowledge, and cultural awareness. Introduces increasingly complex grammatical aspects.	
1640/1641	<p>American Sign Language 3</p> <p>Prerequisite <i>American Sign Language 2</i></p>	ASL 3 is a continuation of ASL 2. Expands vocabulary, grammatical knowledge, and cultural awareness. Introduces increasingly complex grammatical aspects.
