• Rashida Tlaib: Born in 1976 to Palestinian parents, Rashida Tlaib is the oldest of 14 siblings. Growing up in Detroit, Tlaib would become the first Muslim to serve in the Mischigan state legislature. In 2018, she became one of two Muslim Americans serving in the US House of Representatives. She is a fierce advocate of Medicaid for all and increasing the federal minimum wage.
