

Ticket Changes & Winter Athletics Update

Yesterday MCPS Athletics announced, beginning this winter season, all spectators ages 11 & up will be charged \$5 for admission to MCPS athletic events. The MCPS season tickets will still be available for the same price – \$24 for students, \$40 for adults. Season passes can be purchased via credit card through the WJ Online payment system on the school website.

Additionally, tickets for contests will be available for purchase online through <https://gofan.co/app/school/MD24855> ***There will be no cash sales for tickets at WJ Winter sports events.***

Tickets must be purchased digitally via <https://gofan.co/app/school/MD24855> Tickets may be pre-purchased, or in most cases, spectators can scan a QR code at the door to purchase tickets. Please note- some games may have limited capacity and tickets will only be available for pre-purchase. These games will be announced.

MCPS will eliminate the \$1 Child Ticket completely.

- All children 10 and under will be admitted free, with a paying adult.
- Middle school students must purchase a ticket and be accompanied by a paying adult.
- There will be one ticket price for MCPS events – \$5 for all spectators 11 and older, GoFan price is \$4 plus \$1 convenience fee).
- Senior citizens over the age of 62 are still admitted without charge to all MCPS regular season contests.
- Current and retired MCPS employees (and one guest) are still admitted free to regular season contests hosted by MCPS schools, per existing protocols and the availability of space.
- MCPS and MPSSAA passes will be honored for events, per existing protocols and the availability of space.
