

The objective of our Flying Aces Club "Maryland Marauding Mustangs" is to teach model airplane building skills to students to help them exercise their creativity: to realize that they are not limited to keyboard-limited virtual creations, but can create physical objects with their own hands. To experience the magic of flight with an airplane that was created from a small pile of sticks and some tissue paper. In building model airplanes students develop the fine-motor skills of their hands and learn that art can be a kinetic thing. They learn to read blueprints (a necessary skill for a wide range of professions such as architecture or engineering), and become able to envision three-dimensional objects from a two-dimensional drawing. In building more complicated airplanes, they will consider the process and its sequential steps of creation to become both proficient and efficient in their work and thus develop some of the decisional skills they will need as a successful adult. Join us to build a variety of simple to complex rubber-powered balsa wood models.
