After school activities meet from 3:15 to 4:20 on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. Buses depart from SGMS at approximately 4:30 and follow the routes in this packet. Students should get on the bus, get picked up, or ride home by 4:30pm each day. Staff supervision can NOT be guaranteed past 5pm.

Students must sign up for activities in the cafeteria the day before the activity meets. Snacks are free to all students and must be requested by signing up the day before the activity.

On the day of the activity, all students should report to the cafeteria after school.* This includes students meeting with teachers. Once in the cafeteria, students will sit by activity, snack will be distributed (if previously requested), and attendance will be collected.

*Sports teams are the exception. After tryouts are concluded and teams are selected, they should then report directly to the locker room to change.

SGMS STEM Scholars	Ms. Rowell	STEM Scholars offers a variety of activities for students interested in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering, & Math. On the first Thursday of every month, students will have the opportunity to participate in instant build challenges. Students will be presented with a challenge, list of guidelines/rules, & a bag of supplies. They will have a limited amount of time to design & build a solution to the challenge using only the provided supplies. Instant challenge days are open to all students & students may join us even if they have never participated before. On the remaining Thursdays (2-3 per month), students will participate in ongoing STEM learning about a variety of topics. Possible topics throughout the year include gaming & coding, calculator controlled robots, electrical engineering & circuit work, designing & building a magnetic levitation train, and more! Participation in these Thursday meetings are expected, as learning & application will build each week.
So What Else: Sports and Recreation Program	So What Else	So what Else’s Sports and Recreation curriculum is designed to develop physically literate individuals who have the knowledge, skills, and confidence to enjoy a lifetime of healthy physical activity and other healthy choices. The program instructs youth on a variety of motor skills and movement patterns to keep them active and engaged in physical activity for 60 minutes. These activities are set up as a series of team games, challenges, and individual events. Each class operates with a theme of the day, which is reflected in the choice of games and activities. Students are introduced to the value of physical activity for health, enjoyment, challenge, self-expression, and social interaction. During each program, students will receive a healthy snack to establish a pattern of healthy eating in addition to physical activity that students can replicate in other areas of their lives. This program promotes team building and gives students a chance to form new relationships with peers, allowing them to build social, character, and leadership skills.
So What Else: Art & Activism	So What Else	The Art & Activism Curriculum is based on a service learning and young activists’ approach to visual and performing arts. Elements of service learning, environmentalism, music and literacy and are consistently interwoven into this dynamic after-school program, teaching students the importance of creative expression and design in their lives and in their communities. Throughout the program students will be exposed to topics such as how art has played pivotal roles in various equal rights movements, how design can affect a community and how individuals can connect and create an impact.
